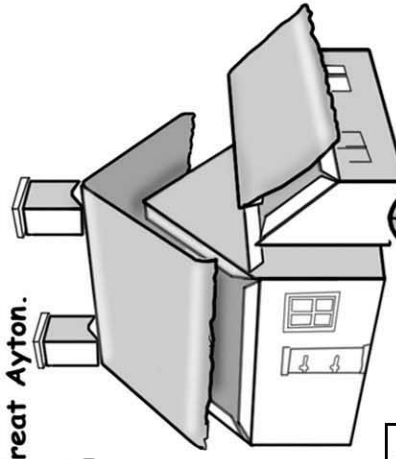
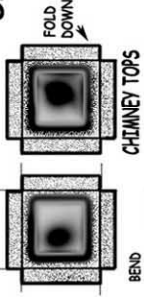
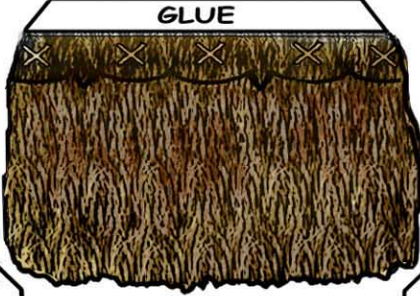
Marston in Cleveland

James Cook was born on the 17th of October, 1728 in a simple thatched cottage located in the village of Marston, which lies on the outskirts of Middlesbrough. The son of a Scottish farm labourer and his Yorkshire wife, he was baptised at the parish Church of Marston St Cuthberts.

James received his basic education in Marston from Mary Walker, a farmers wife, before the family moved in 1736 to Aireyholme Farm, Great Ayton.
